PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 17 SERIES OF 2023

AN **ORDINANCE APPROVING** AND SUPPORTING INCENTIVE-BASED PROGRAM OF THE PROVINCIAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT OFFICE OF BATAAN CALLED "1BATAAN BARANGAY RESILIENCE AWARDS."

WHEREAS, according to Republic Act No. 10121 or the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010, it shall be the policy of the State to "uphold the people's constitutional rights to life and property by addressing the root causes of vulnerabilities to disasters, strengthening the country's institutional capacity for disaster risk reduction and management and building the resilience of local communities to disasters including climate change impacts";

WHEREAS, the Provincial Government is mandated to ensure safe and secured communities against natural and human -induced hazards such as, but not

to, geophysical, hydrometeorological, environmental, chemical, limited biological, technological hazards. This program is also part of the Provincial Government's efforts to integrate and mainstream human-rights-based approach on disaster risk reduction and poverty alleviation, as well as human security through a sustainable development program for the welfare of the Informal Settler Families (ISF), inhabitants, and the citizens of Bataan;

WHEREAS, in line with the Vision of the Provincial Government of Bataan (PGB) of improving the resiliency of Bataeños and the aforesaid mandate of the Provincial Government, the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office will launch a program called "1Bataan Barangay Resilience Awards";

WHEREAS, the "1Bataan Barangay Resilience Awards" is an incentive-based program aimed at mainstreaming climate and disaster risk resilience through the planning, processes, and budgeting at the community level to establish resilience pathways in six areas: evidence-informed leadership and governance, human development systems, sustainable local economy, infrastructure, environment, and human security in all barangays in the Province of Bataan;

WHEREAS, the "1Bataan Barangay Resilience Awards" program includes the following policies and guidelines:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE SANGGUNIANG PANLALAWIGAN OF BATAAN IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

Section 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as "AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND SUPPORTING THE INCENTIVE-BASED PROGRAM OF THE PROVINCIAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT OFFICE OF BATAAN CALLED "1BATAAN BARANGAY RESILIENCE AWARDS."

Section 2. Program Objectives.

1. To build a culture of resilience at the barangay level;

strengthen collaboration among the Provincial Government, City/Municipal Government, Barangays, Department of Interior and Local Government Field Offices, partner academe, and other stakeholders;

3. To help identify opportunities for capacity-building interventions at the barangay level; and

To recognize top-performing barangays and provide incentives.

Section 3. Program Assessment Tools and Delivery Mechanism:

A. Use of Barangay Resilience Bingo Scorecard as an Assessment Tool

1. The program will use the Barangay Resilience Bingo Scorecard (BRBS) developed by National Resilience Council (NRC), in collaboration with the 1Bataan Resilience Council. The BRBS is attached herein as Annex A.

2. BRBS aims to assess the resilience conditions of barangays across Human Development, Local Economy, Infrastructure, Environment, and Human Security, to support building a culture of resilience in barangays across sectors and systems.

3. Each participating barangay will be initially evaluated by a City/Municipal Steering Committee coming from academe and Local Government Units (LGUs) based on their performance for each of the phases of Prepare, Adapt, and Transform.

4. The Barangay Resilience Awards shall be given according to the performance of barangays following the assessment using the BRBS.

- 5. Implementation of the program will be in a three-year timeframe following resilience phases in the BRBS (Prepare/Year 1, Adapt/Year 2, and Transform/Year 3).
- 6. Regular monitoring based on the approved monitoring and evaluation tool shall be conducted by the team created by the PDRRMO.

B. Program Mechanics

- Barangay resilience shall be assessed using the BRBS.
- 2. A standard set of Indicators shall serve as bases for assessment and eventual declaration of winner. The BRBS set of indicators is attached herein as Annex B.
- 3. Should the minimum requirements be inapplicable to the barangays, the City/Municipal Steering Committee may certify inapplicability, upon
- 4. Multiple Assessment Phase. There shall be three (3) phases to be implemented in three years. This shall include:

a. YEAR 1 (PREPARE PHASE)

- Barangay Officials shall assess the resilience of their barangays across the five resilience pillars through the accomplishment of their priority indicators from the 15 indicators in the Prepare Phase.
- Each pattern will be scored depending on the accomplishment level ii. of the indicators selected.
- iii. Special points will be provided to barangays based on special requirements identified by the steering committee (e.g. Seal of Healthy Barangay).
- Barangays that have the most number of points shall be awarded iv. with project grants or cash incentives.

b. YEAR 2 (ADAPT PHASE)

- Barangays will assess their resilience based on 15 Adapt Phase indicators.
- Barangays can have additional bingo cards to include other ii. indicators in the prepare phase not previously included.
- Special points will be provided to barangays based on special iii. requirements identified by the steering committee (e.g. Seal of Healthy Barangay).
- Special points will be provided to Barangays that will fully iv. accomplish all prepare indicators.
- Barangays that have the most number of points shall be awarded V. with project grants or cash incentives.

c. YEAR 3 (TRANSFORM PHASE)

- Barangays will assess their resilience based on the 15 Transform i. Phase indicators.
- Special points will be provided to barangays based on special ii. requirements identified by the steering committee (e.g. Seal of Healthy Barangay).
- Special points will be provided to Barangays that will fully iii. accomplish all adapt indicators.
- Barangays that have the most number of points shall be awarded iv. with project grants or cash incentives.

C. Points System

Indicator accomplishment shall be assessed using the points system below. Each rating based on color coding shall have equivalent points to facilitate the ranking of accomplishments for the Awards. Special points will also be provided following special requirements identified by the steering committee (e.g. Seal of Healthy Barangay).

Section 4. Creation of Steering Committee.

There shall be a creation of Steering Committee for the assessment of the accomplishments of all participating barangays and the validation of the Barangay Scorecards used in the program. The Committee's composition are stated hereunder.

- 1. Municipal/City Steering Committee shall be composed of the Municipal/City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (DRRMO) and Bataan Peninsula State University (BPSU) representatives. The committee may be expanded to include representatives from the resilience pillars to be assessed (Human Development, Local Economy, Infrastructure, Environment, and Human Security), such as the City/Municipal Engineering Office, City/Municipal Health Officer (C/MHO), City/Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (C/MENRO), Local Economic Development and Investment Promotion Office (LEDIPO), and the City/Municipal Planning and Development Office (C/MPDO).
- 2. Provincial Steering Committee shall be composed of the Bataan PDRRMO, 1Bataan Resilience Council, and BPSU Representatives. The committee shall convene, deliberate, validate, monitor, and declare the eventual winner of the award.

Section 5. Specific Roles and Responsibilities at various levels.

1. Barangays

- a. All Barangays in the Province of Bataan are hereby considered as participants to the 1Bataan Barangay Resilience Awards.
- b. Barangay Officials, led by the Barangay Captains shall lead the collection of means of verification (MOVs) to verify the accomplishment of indicators.
- Based on the number of accomplished indicators, assessment through color coding shall be reviewed and reflected accordingly in the scorecard.
- d. Barangay Resilience Bingo Scorecards with complete MOVs shall be submitted to the Municipal/City Steering committees for validation upon the given deadline.
- e. All Barangays shall participate in capacity-building interventions to be provided by the PGB, and the BPSU, NRC, and other partners to support the accomplishment of the scorecard.

2. Steering Committee

- a. Municipal/City Steering Committee shall do the first round validation of the scorecard assessment.
- b. The Provincial Steering committee shall do the 2nd round of validation and finalize the rank of barangays for the awarding.
- c. Based on the scorecard results, NRC, together with the PGB, and BPSU shall facilitate capacity-building interventions for the Barangays to support accomplishment of the scorecards.

Section 6. Awards and Incentives.

1. Most Resilient Barangay (Champion)

- a) Barangay with the most number of points will be awarded Php1,000,000.00.
- b) In case of a tie, the winning barangays will split the cash incentive.

2. Most Resilient Barangays (1st and 2nd Runners Up)

Runners-up will receive project grants based on their barangay master plan.

3. Special Award

Top Performing Barangay per city/municipality will be awarded Php100,000.00.

4. Other Incentives. The Province, City, and Municipalities may further provide non-monetary rewards for the winning and participating barangays.

Section 7. Fund Allocation.

The funding support for this project will come from the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund (LDRRMF) of the PGB.

The PGB through the PDRRMO, may mobilize and receive assistance from partners who will support the awards.

The cash reward shall be used in support of Disaster Risk Reduction-Climate Change Adaptation related programs/projects/activities of the Barangay as indicated in their respective BDRRM Plans. The disbursement and liquidation shall be in accordance with pertinent government accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

Section 8. Repealing Clause. All ordinances, policies, rules and regulations inconsistent herewith are hereby altered, amended or repealed accordingly.

Section 9. Separability Clause. If, for any reason any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional by a competent court, the other parts or provisions hereof not affected shall continue to be in force and effect.

Section 10. Effectivity Clause. The Ordinance shall take effect after compliance of the relevant requirements under the Local Government Code of 1991.
